Legislative Update

Texas Voters passed the **Texas Constitutional Amendment: Proposition 1**. This amendment is a **homestead exemption for partially donated homes of disabled veterans.** "The constitutional amendment authorizing the legislature to provide for an exemption from ad valorem taxation of part of the market value of the residence homestead of a partially disabled veteran or the surviving spouse of a partially disabled veteran if the residence homestead was donated to the disabled veteran by a charitable organization for less than the market value of the residence homestead and harmonizing

certain related provisions of the Texas Constitution.

SBP

Unfortunately, HR.846 and S.339, *The Military Surviving Spouses Equity Act to amend title 10, US code, to repeal the reduction of survivor annuities under the Survivor Benefit Plan by veterans' dependency and indemnity compensation, and other purposes, and end the widows tax, has not passed.*

Scholarship News

Notifications will go out in February to 7 high schools in the area. Belton, Copperas Cove, Gatesville, Killeen, and Temple. This year the essay subject to be announced and applicants will be required to describe a person that exemplifies those traits in 750 to 1500 words.

Applications may be obtained from school counselors and ROTC Units. A school transcript, list of extracurricular activities, letters from teachers, proof of enrollment at a university ROTC unit and the essay will be required as part of the application.

Applications are due back in April, 2018.

One \$1500 and one \$1000 scholarship will be awarded this year.

These deals are good for military spouses of eligible service members even without the member being present.
- 2. Amusement Parks:** Busch Gardens or Sea World or Colonial Williamsburg. Make sure you call ahead, check their website, or visit your local ITT office to ask about military discounts.
- 3. Deployment Items:** Sweet Dream Picture Pillows offers free pillows to children of deployed service members. Celebrate the end of a deployment with a memorable homecoming? BuildASign offers free homecoming banners.
- 4. Home Depot/Lowes/Discount Tire:** 10% year-round military discount.
- 5. Restaurants:** Hard Rock Cafe, Greene Turtle, Ryan's, Melting Pot, lots of restaurants offer military discounts. Even though some chain restaurants like Chick-Fil-A may offer a military appreciation night or a discount in one location, it doesn't mean all of them do
- 6. Clothing and accessories:** Stores like Old Navy, Banana Republic, New York and Company, Rack Room Shoes, Payless and many, many more. Some stores offer discounts both in store and online, call or check the website for details.
- 7. Cruises:** cruise lines like Norwegian Cruise Line, MSC Cruises and Disney Cruise Line and book your trip through MOAA.
- 8. Home Décor:** Kirkland's, Sam's Club, BJ's, Costco and Build.com.
- 9. Movie theaters:** Cinemark and Regal offer military discounts on tickets.
- 10. Target** matches Amazon, Costco and Sam's prices and you don't have the membership fees.

Spotlight on Member *Colonel Aaron Zook, Jr*

By the time Aaron Zook was 10 years old he knew he wanted to become a member of the military. His dad, as an Air Force NCO, took him to the flight line to watch the jets take off at Soesterberg Air Base, Netherlands. Aaron enlisted in the USAF in January 1974 to see the world. By becoming a Korean Linguist, he began his journey.

The first permanent duty was in Okinawa, Japan after the training and technical schools including Airborne. But, he didn't stop there. He served 2 years inactive Reserve while attending Penn State University, then applied for OCS and was commissioned as a 2nd Lt. US Army in 1984. His initial plan was to advance to General and he served his country well to retire as a Colonel in 2009.

Aaron looks for areas to serve others through organizational leadership, performing to achieve excellence in any endeavor. He is a generalist, visionary, and creative leader who enjoys working with other leaders for the betterment of their organization or community. When working with others, he enjoys spending time learning who they are and what they would like to accomplish.

Looking back, his favorite assignment was Okinawa, Japan where it is sunny, warm, tropical paradise and where he met his wife, Joyce. She has enjoyed every assignment as a family. Even understanding the necessity of deployments and long training exercises. He even enjoyed the duty at the Pentagon in the Personnel Transformation Directorate. He keeps in touch with a network of friends he made throughout the military including his best friend while he served in Goeppingen, Germany and began his affiliation in the Officer's Christian Fellowship.

One of the funniest things to happen to him was in basic training where he was on fire-watch. "We were not to allow anyone, no matter what, into our area through the only entrance (a steel fire-door) unless they were recognized as a Training Instructor (TI) and showed their ID card. A TI came by to test me. After he ranted and raved, pounded on the door, and threatened me with a court-martial, I opened the door. He didn't show me his ID card. Needless to say, I was in hot water! I ended up scrubbing the showers with a toothbrush for what seemed like 3 days."

Organization, proactive leadership, connecting with others and strategic thinking are the key components in the training and experiences that we should use in other organizations when one retires. "Whether it's an organization such as MOAA or something different, our hearts should be bettering the world in the local or national way. Until the end time arrives for each person, great or small, we can contribute to the very end."

The military is an "excellent place to start. It might not be the right career path for many, but it does not fit all. The military is exciting, adventurous, enjoyable, and world-spanning—a great way to serve our country. If you want to figure out what is the right thing to do in your life, the training and experiences of the military will be a superb foundation to begin your journey into adulthood."

Some examples of the confidence and will to succeed in the military are:

"If your desire is to be in a place where you can be paid for your work every month as long as you perform the minimum requirements, the military provides a place for that person. If you desire to obtain confidence and determination, the basics of the military will help instill that in any individual as long as they are willing to learn. For those who already have confidence and will to succeed, becoming a senior NCO or officer provides the opportunities to lead others and to succeed in many ways."
